MU Sigma

There are various tournaments that have been on my "must-do" list for years (such as Kings Cup, now called Kings Trophy in Thailand - coming up to 20 consecutive years). The January event in Bangalore/Bengaluru is one of those. With four days and 34 games, it is one of the longest, comparable to 32 for WESPAC, 31 for NSC (North American Scrabble Championship), and 30 for UK Open.

This event was started by iGATE. When Capgemini took over iGATE, they inherited sponsorship of the event. Whilst they did a good job for two years, it was not their first choice of events to sponsor.

At the 2019 (and last) Capgemini, an elderly gentleman (96) made his debut, and thoroughly enjoyed it. He was concerned that the tournament would be lost, so he spoke to his grandson, the CEO of yet another IT Company (Bangalore is the IT centre of India). His grandson offered sponsorship of the event, at Mu Sigma.

They provided excellent facilities, including a cafeteria offering free breakfast, lunch, and hot/cold drinks. Mu Sigma staff also assisted with technical tasks, like live-streaming of games and inputting result.

Three of the four sections ran over 4 days, with the lowest group, mostly beginners, playing only one day. What excites me is the rapidly growing number of youth competing in India ... there were round 30 in this event. Two of them braved B division – Madhav and Suyash (pictured), who both performed





spectacularly at the recent WESPA Youth Cup (formerly called World Youth Scrabble Championship). Madhav was Under 10 World Champion, as well as winning the award for the most WESPA-rated games played over a year (220). Suyash was Under 12 Champion, and also won the prize for most-improved, jumping from 102nd in 2018 to 37th in 2019.

Around 150 players from eight countries competed, with some of the best players in the world featured. As usual, Nigel won overall. Marlon Prudencio (Singapore) lead for most of the event. However, because of the format of repeated KOH (King of the HIII) rounds on the last day, Marlon then had to play Nigel 5 times.

This repeat KOH is something I dislike, because it can mean that a player who deserves to come at least second, actually can be forced down a number of places, as happened to Marlon (who played the most difficult tournament of anyone there, but was relegated to 5th by the strange format). I played Dr Jakkrit (Thailand) 4 times, and managed to win one, the first time I have beaten him ... my only triumph for the event. Whilst I would have preferred a format with a wider range of opponents, I will certainly return next year.

Rules Update

Tournament Etiquette re: Leaving the room, has now been changed to the Rules 6.6.

6.6 If a player must leave the room mid-game for emergency/health reasons, the TD should be made aware that this is happening. If at all possible before leaving, the player should make their move, neutralise the clock, and not replace tiles. Their opponent may continue to consider their next move. When the absent player returns, the opponent's clock is started.

Just to clarify. Within the Tournament Etiquette there was the mention about leaving the room during play. Tournament Etiquette are guidelines only. The Rules Committee was asked to look at this and maybe add this to the Tournament Rules. In doing so and after much discussion the Rules Committee voted in favour to the motion to have the Etiquette guideline moved to the National Rules as a Rule.

This is not my traveller's tale but an extension of a previous tale compiled from email and blogs.

In the last issue of ATB I related our experiences on a yacht sailing from Malaga in Spain to Gibraltar. And also deck building on a farmhouse in Nova Scotia.

Those two branches of our family recently came together for a joint adventure. After we left the yachties in Gibraltar they sailed on to Portugal for a while. The grand plan to cross the Atlantic was taking shape.

The crossing would be Portugal to the Canary Islands then onto Cape Verde Islands then across to French Guyana (GUANAY) [or Guiana (IGUANA)] in South America.

The self steering gear was installed in Gibraltar as well as a replacement 10-person life raft. Self inflating life jackets were purchased for those who had outgrown theirs.

Supermarkets were scoured for non perishable foods to stock the boat for a 3-5 week crossing. Routines on a boat need to be adhered to. Everything taken on to a yacht has to be analysed as to its consequences. A packet of spaghetti (for example) has packaging that needs to be disposed of. All waste has to be taken off and deposited ashore, sometimes by dinghy. And many coastal communities don't welcome yacht people dumping their garbage.

So, mindful that packaging waste would need to be stored in valuable space many containers were topped up with staples such as flour, rice, pasta, dried fruit.

Research and talking to others in the yachting community would let them know availability of produce in the stop off locations.

Fresh fruit and vegetables would be used in order of storability. Strawberries have a short use-by date whereas carrots, onions and potatoes last for weeks. Meat depends on a deep freeze. Precooked meals last a few days. Yacht made yoghurt recipe is currently doing the rounds on the yachting fraternity (or is it sorority?).

A satellite phone was installed with limited internet capability. We were able to track their

progress on a website as their location was transmitted every hour.

When sailing anywhere somebody needs to be on watch at all times. With Mum and Dad and a 7 year old and a 5 year old this could prove exhausting over 3 weeks, more so over 5 weeks.

So airline pilot brother of Mum rearranged his shifts and joined them in Cape Verde. His task was to take over night watch shifts. And he was also in charge of fishing. Somewhere out there he caught a large Mahi-mahi which he served up with coconut cream and the last of the onions. Another meal was prepared using up salad vegetables and a bean mix. All ready to go then a large wave sent it all crashing to the floor. Ten second rule was applied there.

They took 15 days to reach French Guyana and dropped anchor at Devil's Island, made famous by the book and movie **PAPILLON**. They were only able to anchor there one night as there was a rocket launch from the mainland and the trajectory passes over the island. Rockets from French Guyana supply the international Space Station as it is deemed to be a part of metropolitan France and close to the equator, which is the most efficient launching latitude.

They then moved up a country to Suriname (ANEURISM), but on arrival nothing much was open as there was a murder trial in progress and public offices had shut down. The defendant? The ex President.

The capital city Paramaribo, is on a river and they sailed quite a way up. Swimming is not recommended as there are populations of **PIRANHA** in that river, a **CARNIVOROUS** (**CORONAVIRUS**#) fish with a bad reputation.

At the time of writing they are moving up to the coast of South America then across to Grenada in the Carribean (CARABINER) as the extra crew member has to get back into the real world, ie find a flight home. I bet he will be checking out prices of yachts pretty soon.

We are not sure what the next stage of their journey will be. Eventually a Pacific crossing is most likely.

I knew I could work that word in somehow!

Her next delicious insult is almost playable: we can have the noun **BUFFLEHEAD-S**, but alas, not the *buffleheaded **CLUNCH** referred to on page 15 by someone claiming not to be a **GAPESEED**..."

On page 16 Waldo admits that when he was younger he was a **CAWKER** (10) and explains that "- it seems so **HARDFISTED** (DE) (11) not to come to Laurie's rescue."

"If you have the words, there's always a chance that you'll find the way." Seamus Hearney, Irish poet and playwright.

To make Bingoes, club players usually begin by searching for prefixes and suffixes on their racks to form a possible word. "I love a REREMOUSE, but I hate meeces to pieces." Mr. Jinks. "Change the way you look at things and the things you look at change." Wayne W. Dyer. However, there are other types of affixes that can arise from time to time. These are not normally mentioned in grammar text books, apparently it's because they are rare in English grammer but not other languages. Maybe they're part of the Da Vinci Code – cryptex.

Circumfix is the type that has an added prefix + suffix to a word e.g. EMBOLDEN - 'em' & 'en'; DELIGHTED - 'e-d' affixes; RETHINKS with a prefix+s or the 'a-ing' affixes e.g. ABATING.

Infix/adfix - 'An infix is a word element that can be inserted within the base form of a word–rather than at its beginning or end– to create a new word or intensify meaning.' Dictionary meaning.

Tmesis a type of infix (pl. tmeses), is a word that includes another word inside it. Some definitions of the term state that the word being split must be a compound word, (e.g. Shakespearean 'some-other-where') though other definitions state that any word may be split in order to become a tmesis. The most common type of tmesis in English grammer is the expletive, as in 'fan-bloody-tastic'." The rule; you insert the expletive between the accented words. However, most people do it naturally, not even knowing the rule.

Cojoin infix is typically two nouns joined together into one word e.g. SPEEDoMETER or HANDiWORK etc. the 'o' & 'i' are infixes. For Scrabblers a MOtZA BONAnZA etc.

"Kitchen table scrabble to competition scrabble is the difference between playing Chopsticks and playing a Chopin suite." Stefan Fatsis author Word Freaks.

Esful infix inserts an 's' before the suffix 'ful'. For Scrabblers, esp. the Bingoist - (Definition; 'a player who deems, if it's not a 7 or 8 letter

word then I don't want to know about it') this type is handy to know you can move the 's' around , e.g. TEACUPFULS >TEACUPSFUL. I get that!

Here is the list of 'ful' words that infix the 's' - up to 9 letter words - ARMSFUL; BAGSFUL; CANSFUL; CUPSFUL; GUTSFUL; HATSFUL; JARSFUL; JUGSFUL; FORKSFUL; HANDSFUL; PAILSFUL; ROOMSFUL; SACKSFUL; SPOONSFUL; PLATESFUL; SCOOPSFUL; TABLESFUL

Why these words and not the other 'ful' noun words like CAPFUL, TANKFUL, WAGONFUL, etc. are not included? If it started out, as they say; "arms full of packages" armsful; where the 's' is added to the substantive then why isn't it true for all such words, why not 'basin', you can have 'basins full of water'? It appears to be some sort of weird grammar evolution.

SYBIL Fawlty: "Why don't you just call the 17 words exceptions and learn them?".

BASIL Fawlty: "Can't we get you on Mastermind, Sybil? Next contestant – Sybil Fawlty from Torquay. Special subject – the bleedin' OBVS."

Guest (Scrabble player): "Are you serious, why would I want to do that, my brain cells are already MAXED-to-the-ful, besides it sounds weari-bloody-some."

Sure, you have anagrams, alphagrams, stems, pleiads, valuations etc. but in my humble opinion, I guess the Holy Grail for a Scrabbler is when a player realises that the za, zo, ze, xi, xu, jo, ja, gi, gin etc, can all be treated as affixes, then a whole plethora of possibilities awaken, my LILL ZAMOUSE. Imagine, finding out -'for' takes 'ze'&'za' FORZE & FORZA, then along COMEDO a Bingo! FORZATI (and then what happened) FORZATO (and then he tied her to the railway tracks) FORZANDO (and then he lit the fuse to the dynamite) FORZANDI (and then along came JONES smooth talking JONES) front 's' hook -SFORZANDI (a NINER for the triple) etc. UGH! he & she UGH - HEUGH & SHEUGH. A plethora of UGHS - PLEUGHS!

The 2019 WESPA Youth Cup, formerly known as World Youth Scrabble Championships, was held at the prestigious SMK Aminuddin Baki School in Kuala Lumpur Malaysia.

Six junior players from Australia competed over 3 days of competition against 190 players from 18 nations.

Ronnie Bennett (ACT) finished 15th overall and also got 3rd prize in the under 14 age division.

The Australian players gained eligibility on the basis of number of rated tournaments played. Our quota was unfilled meaning we did not have to apply a ratings filter to qualifying criteria.

Each young player was accompanied by at least one parent. Some were accompanied by both parents and siblings.

Funding support to the players was provided by a combination of direct donations, a GoFundMe campaign, tee shirt sales and fundraising tournaments. Nearly all of the funds raised have been disbursed equally to the six participating families, with a small balance retained for kickstarting the 2020 campaign (details to come later).

Tisa Ng and I had volunteer roles as helpers assisting the director. Australians featured prominently on the administration side of things.

My other role was as the Team Coach.

Patrick Huynh and his mum, Alex Lam and his dad, Tisa and I traveled together to KL from Sydney one week before the comp started.

We stayed in the same apartment complex which made it easier to conduct coaching sessions.

We also attended a training session hosted by Karen Richards in which consensus games were played. This appeared to be a very effective and authentic way of highlighting the various skills that the players needed to work on.

Despite efforts to get the Aussie team together on the Tuesday before the event, we did not come together as a whole team until the morning of the tournament. The main

reason for this was that apart from Alex and Patrick, other players stayed at different locations - geographically not that far apart, but it did make it difficult to link up. The Pakistan team and the Thai team stayed in the same accommodation which I'm sure helped in their preparations (note for future years!).

The Aussie team held training sessions between 1pm and 6pm prior to the tournament which were attended by those that could make it.

Training consisted of game play and post game analysis working on skills such as board awareness, tracking, time management and procedures. The use of the app Anagram Quizzer proved to be a good method of building word power and hook awareness, and was utilised in more informal settings, such as travelling on the Metro, in Grabs and at cafes.

Observing the games it was obvious that the players at the top half of the field had strong scrabble skills. The words on these boards indicated study of the high to medium

probability 7s and 8s, as well as 3-4 hook words. The tournament had "free challenge" however in the lower quarter of the field there remained quite a few phonies on the boards.

During the games, I ditched my hat as coach and assumed my other role which involved responding to players requests for adjudications as well as general observation and attendance of the playing area and making rule reminders as required.

In previous years there were problems with tile drawing technique and parents approaching their children during play. However, apart from the occasional reminder to hold the bag higher and to avert eyes, the overall standard of following the rules was high.

And parents respected requests to avoid the playing area. In my opinion, the overall standard of following rules and etiquette was higher than the average Australian rated tournament.

Electronic devices were banned from the playing area, and during challenges both players consistently went to the challenge computer with the challenge typing the word and the challenged player verifying the word/s typed.

The most common rule reminder I needed to make was in correctly designating the blank tile, followed by reminding players not to start clocks after a challenge until their opponent was seated. Small things.

I needed to refer to the Rules Manual twice for trickier adjudications for tiles being drawn out of turn.

Apparently a rare event for KL, a power cut impacted play on the final day. Fortunately there was enough natural light to continue playing and the mature attitude of the players and the cool heads of the organisers meant the impact was minimal. It did get a bit stuffy though. The power was restored for the final round and the presentation ceremony.

With regards to the status of Scrabble in the various participant countries, it was clear that the nations of Pakistan, Thailand, Sri Lanka as well as host nation Malaysia take the promotion of Scrabble to youth seriously. Without wanting to dismiss the effort and achievements of any of our current young players and supporters, if Australia is to hold its head proud in this event, we need to do more to provide the opportunity that Scrabble offers to the children who have the potential to excel.

The families of the parents are very appreciative of the support from the Scrabble community in helping get them to Malaysia: not just financial, but in being open to allowing children to participate in regular tournaments and modelling good tournaments etiquette. And of course, the hints and tips you've shared.

It was a great experience and I look forward to travelling with a slightly larger team in 2020.

Proposed New Australian Youth Award Commencing 2021

I'd like to give advance notice of this award to allow young players and their parents and supporters to commence working towards qualifying.

I have placed a motion before CASPA to have a new annual National Youth Award, the Australian Youth Champion.

This is to be determined by the best result by a player yet to have reached their 16th birthday in the Championship division of the Australian Scrabble Championship. It will be prestigious award which requires firstly that a young player must achieve the ratings necessary to play in the top division. It will also add an extra exciting dimension to an existing great tournament. As I write this, only one Australian junior player is eligible, but I am hoping this situation will change in 2021 and beyond as we extend our efforts in youth promotion.

I thought is was time to update my earlier article "The Rich List" (March 2017 ATB, p 20).

To derive my list I multiplied the player's number of ratable games (obtainable from the National Rating list) by their average score (taken from their personal statistical summary). Only active players who have played at least one ratable event in the last 12 months are included.

Since my last 2017 update I am delighted to induct another two players (Joanne Craig and Peter Shaw) who have scored 2 million or more points in tournament play, taking my list to six players:

Australia currently has 51 active players, or almost 9% of the players on our current rating list who have achieved over 1 million points (up from 41 players and about 6% respectively in 2017). About a half of these players reside in NSW.
