Seniors World Championship

One hundred and thirty-three players contested the Seniors World Championship on the Gold Coast in August. Esther Perrins is the new Seniors Champion.

Esther (nee Byers) is a past UK Champion, as well as part of the "Rest of the World" team. who were runners-up at Alchemist Cup last vear. She is also the highest-finishing female ever, in a World Event, finishing 3rd in WESPAC15. The top ten finishers included three former Senior Champions (Joanne Craig, Howard Warner and Tony Sim). There were 5 countries represented in the top 10

places - South Africa, Singapore, Malaysia, New Zealand, and Australia.

Full list of prize-winners follows. For many years, we have been told that "55 is not classed as Senior". We thought about moving the cutoff to 60+. However, We hope to have found a compromise in the new prize structure. Players in the 55 to 59 age groups were entitled to place prizes only. Whereas those 60 an over were also competing for their Championship prizes. This mean that the player finishing second, could receive

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more than the winner (ie age champion prize plus second place). We feel this model is fair, considering that the best player in the world will be 55 in a few years.

Total prize money was \$9,380. Overall Champion received \$1000, and Age Champions received \$500.

Next year, the World Seniors event will be held in Malta, in association with MISO, in late April, for those born 1965 or earlier.

Katharine Susannah Pritchard being one of Australia's novelists is likely to be forgotten, and that would be a great shame.

She wrote beautifully, her plots and characters are highly believable, and her settings - especially those in Western Australia - lovingly and poetically described, botanically, geologically and meteorologically:

I've been rereading her 1928 novel, Coonardoo, and am especially struck by the amount of time she takes to describe the sky: so it is particularly apt that I should find (outside a Scrabble word list) the use of SKYEY! The Collins 2019 list has introduced SKYIER (1) and SKYIEST. Collins 19 lists 115 words beginning with SKY - ... of course. not ALL of them have to do with "That Eye, the Sky"... nevertheless, I'm impressed.

I had to reread the book to try, unsuccessfully, to locate where SKYEY was used: in the process, I found several interesting words ..first, on page 41, regarding a muster, "Hugh was anxious to weed out crocks and old **ENTIRES**." (2) One of six anagrams ..

Never mind the pages .. more words I found and liked were **writhen** ... "having a twisted

or distorted form", as has one of the characters in the book;

RUCKLED. used more than once to describe the landscape ...wrinkled or creased ...you know the front hook!

STANDSTILL, which (in true Scrabble style, because it's a noun,) takes an -S!!

SONSY to describe Hugh's wife when first she appears ...she does NOT become a **SONSIER SENIOR** ...then again, maybe she does ...


PARKY, to describe the coldness of the day ... it too has a too obvious front hook, as do the extensions **PARKIER** and **PARKIEST**. (Never heard of that before!)

New South Wales

Tournament Roundup

Tournaments in NSW were spread far and wide during the quarter. First it was to Ulladulla on 19th & 20th May for their annual championship.

Chris Ostrowski, our trusted equipment officer, was the popular winner of A Division from Dianne Brumby who was paying a visit from the Apple State. the the title of Ulladulla Champion went to Monica Dwyer, all the way from Newcastle, who won 11 of the 14 games to win B Division. The winner of Division C was Kerry Friend of Nowra Club.

The following weekend saw the Scrabble action move to Junee for the Tri-State Challenge. 36 players turned up at our latest venue, the June RSL Club.

Barry Harridge from Victoria won 8 out of the 10 games to win the A Division while Hanne Marks from NSW was too good for her opponents in winning B Division. This year the Tri-State trophy went to the NSW team.

A week later the action moved to the Ourimbah RSL on the Central Coast for their 'Jack Frost' tournament. Here the winners were Rod Talbot (A Division), Sandra Elliott, main organiser (B Division) and relative newcomer Julie Banister in C Division.

The Wollongong WORDS Winter tournament took place in mid June with 44 players taking part in 3 Divisions. In A Division, Rod Talbot was the winner on margin, while in B Division, returning player Felicity Devitt won with 7 wins of 8 wins. In C Division, Julie Banister won again, proving that her win two weeks earlier was no fluke.

Only 25 players took part in the two-day Winter Challenge for players under 1300 rating. We welcomed Arnold Appelhof from Queensland who scored the high game of 529, while the twice aforementioned Julie Banister achieved high word score of 130 for her QUAINTER. It was an extremely close affair at the finish, with Chery Michler winning her final game against Pam Bennett to snatch first place by half a win. Pam was relegated to 2nd place with Anne Hough, down from Coffs Harbour, third with 10.5 wins out of the 16 games.

Two weeks later at the same Waitara venue, only 24 players made it to the Winter Masters, with one dropping out after Day 1 forcing the dreaded bye on several players.

Chris May was attempting to emulate his 2018 feat of 17 wins of 18, and very nearly did it, losing only game 15 to Bob Jackman, the eventual runner-up four wins behind. Joanne Craig had to forgo a game due to sickness, possibly costing her second place. Chris notched up the high game of 624 while Norma Tracey had the high scoring word with **RESOWING** for 194.

The second Empire Bay Mini tournament for players under 1400 was organised by Robyn Cameron, who stepped up due to Denise Smith's inability to be involved.

Under the tutelage of George Khamis, who directed on the day, Robyn capably pulled it off. There were two Divisions on the day, A Division being won by Linda Hawkes and B Division by Jan Consoli, both Central Coast locals.

The last tournament for the quarter to be reported on was the Cabramatta Youth Fundraiser, organised by Tony and Tisa Hunt. Here Bob Jackman prevailed by winning all 7 games over John Hamilton in A Division while in B Division young up-and-comer Asher Chhabra also won all 7 games to clinch victory There was no prizemoney, with all proceeds going to our youth contingent at the World Youth Championship in Malaysia later in the year.

Matchplay Progress

In Division A, Chris May and Esther Perrins have won there way through to the final, while

Division B has reached the stage whereby Monica Dwyer will play the winner of Janine Whittaker and Natalie Tadday in the final.

Hunter Happenings from Monica Dwyer

We are in the final few weeks of our Scrabble Network experiment for the region for this year with lots of enthusiasm for those still in it.

We've tweaked the prize structure and introduced a handicap system for the rated players, both of which have gone down well with the players.

A final review will take place in November in order to determine the future shape of the network.

I thought & looked at the list & realised I knew more than two thirds of this list already, all I have to do is figure out how to remember the rest? To do this there are various techniques & tools (THANX, Nick) available to the astute player. 'Sir, do you have a rewards card?'

Acronyms & acrostics are very useful to a Scrabble player where rote/ reinforcement

methods have failed or deemed too tedious. I'll give you an example of each that you may already know. These involve the colours of the rainbow in order, Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Indigo, Violet:-

Acronym – the first letter of each word to make a name - Roy G. Biv

Acrostic – a verse or line using the first or last letters – Richard Of York Gave Battle In Vain. Nick (Kyrgios) butts in again; "Show me the rule."

I've made up my own for various words, you are more likely to remember the words if you make-up your own. The following acronym came about when I was having problems with 3 letter 'ai' words. To do this I dismissed the 'ai' words I already knew (too much clutter) & just concentrated on the unusal suspects (yeah, sounds like a movie). I then re-arranged the remaining letters to form a proper name – JAK STRAW. In history, Jak Straw was one of three leaders of the Pheasant's Revolt of 1381 AD in England & in the modern era a politician in the US.

Jai Aia Kai Sai Tai Rai Ait Wai 'Do you want FRIES with that?' Yeah, I know - they're called potato straws here.


Thankyou - fatwaed, greebo(s), grizzes, rieved, thigged.

How's that pronounced then? imipenem, lilangenis, natriuresises, oxaloacetic, oxyanion, parapraxises, pericarditides, sceuphylaciums (Nigel - note it now takes an - S), tadalafil, tikinagan.

Editor's Note: Nothing highlighted, work it out for yourselves.

Apparently the actress Bo Derek received this accolade for her role in the 1979 comedy "10" however I'm guessing our readers are more interested in the 21st century rather than the 20th and what the body of a perfect 10 might look like in a Scrabble playing context instead.

To do this we need to go to Thailand for the round 26 clash from the 2016 Brand's Crossword Game King's Cup between Pichai Limprasert and Panupol Sujjayakorn. Early on in the game Pichai to move and narrowly trailing 81 – 106 has the rack EEILOST:



Neither of the two bonus words ESTOILE and ETOILES are playable, nor can any eight letter bonus words be played through any of the available floating letters. Pichai settled on the word TOE at 2C, for 16 points, leaving a promising rack EILS and making the play that the Quackle considered was best.

A few turns later on with Pichai again to move but this time narrowly leading 281 – 251 has the rack EEIKLNS.

According to Quackle the best plays are based on dumping the K whilst scoring around 20 – 30 points and preserving a balanced set of 2-5 letters that retains the S.

My choice was KNEE at 13F, leaving ILS for 29 points, which Quackle ranked as 3rd best. Pichai was thinking along similar lines to me but chose another word, (A)NKLE at F8 for 19 points, leaving IES instead!



With words like TOE, KNEE and ANKLE we've pretty well covered the lower quarter of the body but what does a perfect ten look like to a Scrabble player? Panupol to move with an empty bag and trailing 424 – 458 has the letters NT on his rack:

Fittingly Panupol finishes the game with the best play possible - the word T(E)N at M12 for exactly 10 points!

Not a very instructive example this time around but maybe a humerus (in keeping with the anatomical theme of this article) one instead!?
